# **SPANISH** MINOR FOR BRIDGE STUDENTS

**Declared Fall 2020 or Later** 

The Spanish Minor requires a minimum of **18 upper-division credits** listed under SPAN. (Option 1 students will take 21 credits.) At least 6 credits have to be taken at the University of Utah. All courses must be passed with a grade of C or better. CR/NC may NOT be elected for these courses.

Students must complete the lower-division language sequence of 1010, 1020, 2010, and 2020, or the equivalent, before enrolling in any upper-division language courses.
